Cheryl has donated her time to this project and will not be invoicing the District for her service. Cheryl has been an integral part of the process and organized all of the work performed. Thank you, Cheryl. I enclose Bylaw 2013 to remove the funds related to this project from reserve.

MAYNE ISLAND IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT BYLAW NO. 212

A bylaw for imposing taxes upon land and improvements in the improvement district, and to provide for imposing a percentage addition to encourage prompt payment thereof.

The trustees of Mayne Island Improvement District ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1. The following taxes (Rates) for the Health Centre and Heliport are hereby imposed and levied for the year 2022:

- 2. The minimum amount of taxation upon a parcel of real property will be fifteen dollars (\$15.00).
- 3. The aforementioned taxes are due and payable on or before the 4th day of July, 2022 and a late penalty consisting of percentage addition of fifteen percent (15%) of the amount thereof will be added to all taxes remaining unpaid after the said date.
- 4. Taxes payable to the Improvement District will bear interest at the rate prescribed by the Lieutenant Governor in Council under the *Taxation (Rural Area)* Act from March 1 next following the date on which they are levied, until paid or recovered as set out under Section 717 of the *Local Government Act*.
- 5. This bylaw may be cited as the "Mayne Island Tax Bylaw 2022".

MAYNE ISLAND IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT BYLAW No. 213

A bylaw to authorize the disbursement of monies from the Fire Department Capital Works Renewal Reserve Fund.

WHEREAS there is an estimated unappropriated balance in the Fire Department Capital Works Renewal Reserve Fund of three hundred and ninety-three thousand, five hundred and twelve dollars and twenty-five cents (\$393,512.25) as at the 26th day of April, 2022 which amount has been calculated as follows:

Balance in Fund at December 31, 2021	\$ 397	7,718.94
Add: Budgeted additions to fund, interest	\$	793.31
Deduct: Total disbursements & outstanding appropriated funds to-date	\$	0.00
Unappropriated balance in Reserve Fund as at April 26 th , 2022	\$ 393	3,512.25

AND WHEREAS it is deemed desirable to expend a portion of the monies imposed under Bylaw No.107, for the purpose of weatherproofing the exterior sprinkler system water storage infrastructure.

The Trustees of the Mayne Island Improvement District ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. The sum of up to sixteen thousand dollars (\$16,000.00) is hereby appropriated from the Fire Department Capital Works Renewal Reserve Fund for fire safety equipment upgrade.
- 2. The expenditures to be carried out by the monies hereby appropriated will be more particularly specified and authorized by motion, to be passed by the Trustees.
- 3. Should any of the above amount remain unexpended after the expenditures hereby authorized have been made, any unexpended balance will be returned to the credit of the said Reserve Fund.
- 4. This bylaw may be cited as the "2022 Fire Department Capital Works Reserve Fund Disbursement Bylaw (fire safety equipment)".

- Fire fighters in the building or on the apparatus will have the choice to wear a mask or not.
- Medical first responder protocols remain unchanged; first responders are required to wear a medical mask during all patient contact, and an N95 and additional PPE for patient contact when communicable disease risk is present.
